- Box 2 CIVIL WAR (1861-1865)
Prints (original), includes mostly photomechanical prints depicting African American Union troops in their encampments, on military review, cheered by crowds, or in battle against Confederate forces; African American civilians working for Union forces; and some portraits of Union and Confederate generals
- Box 3 CIVIL WAR (1861-1865)
Photographs (oversized), images from various locations in Virginia, dated 1863-1865, include individual and group portraits of African American Union troops and teamsters, a group of Contrabands, a view of a hanged African American soldier, and a view of battle dead being collected. Also depicted are the Company E, 4th U.S. Colored Infantry at Fort Lincoln, Washington, D.C. (1865) and the camp of the Tennessee Colored Battery (1864)
- Box 4 CIVIL WAR (1861-1865)
Print collection, includes photographic and photomechanical prints depicting African American Union troops on review, in their encampments, in combat with Confederate forces, and troop movements in-between battles.
- Box 5 CIVIL WAR (1861-1865)
Photographs (reproductions), includes individual and group portraits of African American Union troops, portraits of white Union officers, views of Union encampments, and some views of battle sites after the fighting ended.
- Box 6 CIVIL WAR (1861-1865)
Prints (reproductions), includes photographic prints of engravings, illustrations, woodcuts and paintings mostly depicting African American Union troops in battle against Confederate forces, including the assault on Fort Wagner (1863), troops marching through Southern cities and greeted by liberated slaves, and some views of recruits and Union encampments. Also included are images of Contrabands.
- Box 7 SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR (1898)
Spanish-American War, includes photographic and photomechanical prints of portraits and group portraits of African American soldiers and officers, troop movements, and scenes of the battles at San Juan Hill and La Quasina, Santiago, Cuba.
